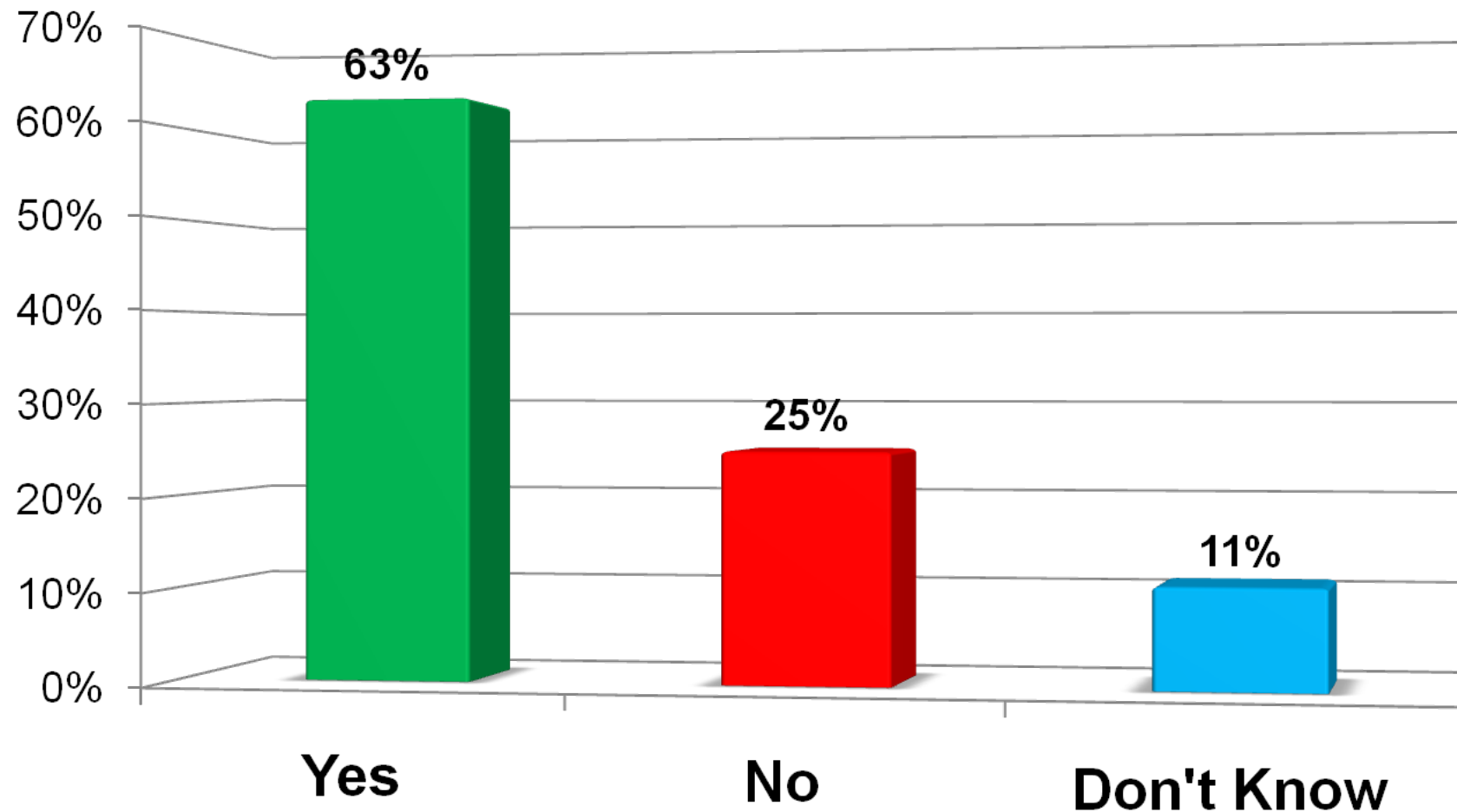
The challenge



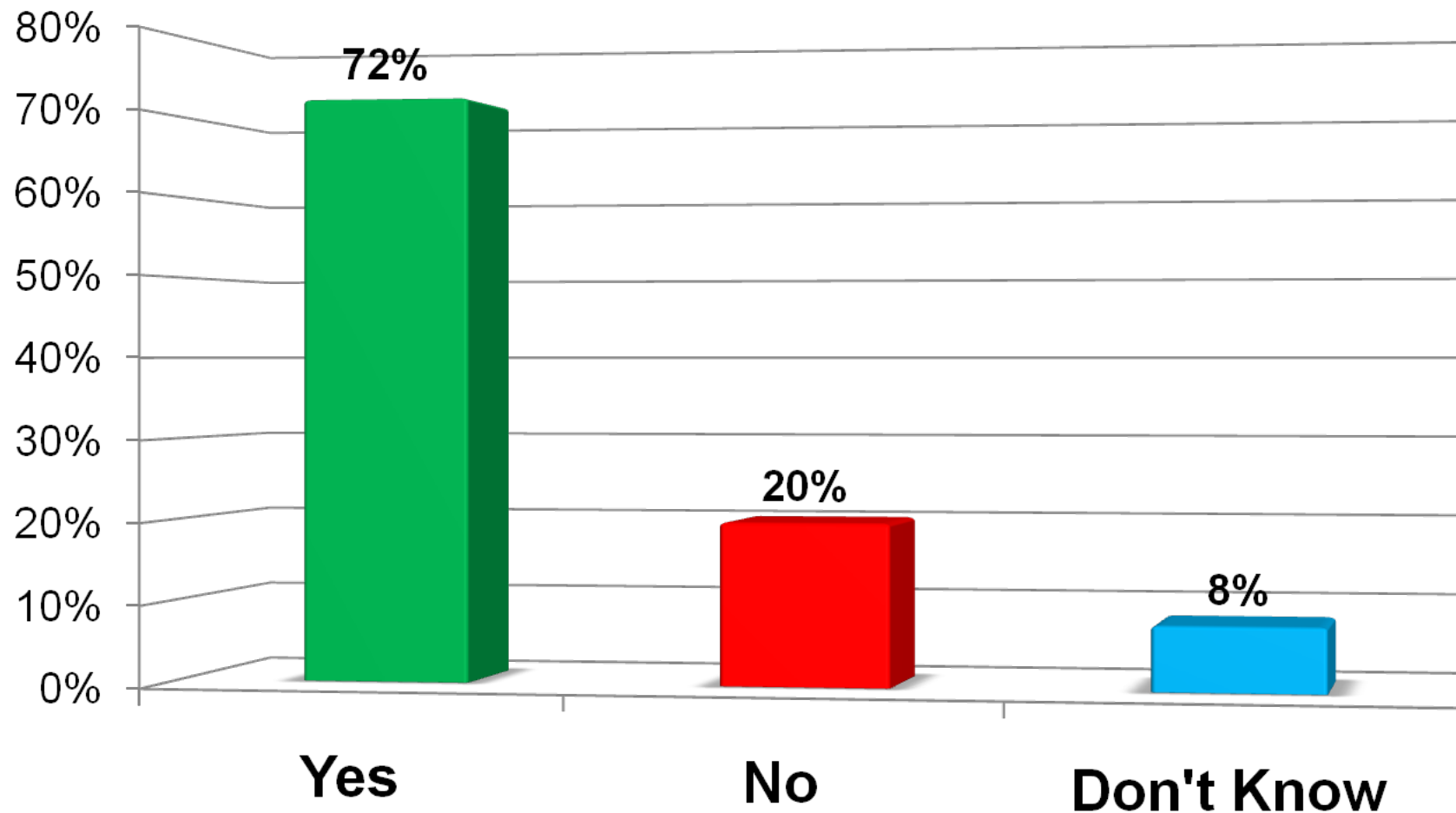
To go beyond clinical indicators to:
